Trauma Informed work with Aboriginal Families

This workshop provides an overview of the multiple impacts of colonisation and how other forms of violent oppression intersect to impact on the everyday lives of people, particularly on the growth and development of children, and their subsequent capacity to manage their adult lives and relationships and parent children. The principles of prevention and early intervention are discussed in this context.

Learning Outcomes:

- Increase knowledge and understanding of trauma and its impact on the growth and development of children and parenting capacities;
- Increased knowledge and understanding of how Aboriginal peoples' experiences of trauma impacts on daily life; and
- Increased confidence to apply acknowledgement of this trauma and oppression to your work through trauma informed practice.
